day of *December* 1855 - until the *twelfth* day of

March 1856 and having *been killed at the battle*

of *March* 1856 is entitled to *Twelve hundred and Eighty*

Acres Bounty Land, for which this is his CERTIFICATE.

And the said *Jonathan Lindley* or his heirs

is entitled to hold said Land, or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same, and to ex=
all rights of ownership over it.

Before me Gwyn Morrison a Notary
Public in and for the said County of Grimes,

duly appointed and qualified, personally came Jesse Grimes
a Citizen of said County to me well known who after being duly
sworn testified that he is personally acquainted with Samuel
Lindley who was in the year 1835 and now is a resident Citizen
of what is now Montgomery County near the line of Walker County,
that the said Samuel Lindley has a reputed son named
Jonathan Lindley who volunteered in the fall of 1836 into the
Army of Texas was one of the party that took San Antonio in 1835
and it is a matter of common notoriety that he was killed at the
fall of the Alamo in 1836. This deponent further testifies
that he does know that the Government of Texas has acknowledged
the services and the death of the said Jonathan Lindley by
granting to his heirs the pay and bounties of land to which he
was entitled for his services, the same being obtained by this depo-
nant from the proper authorities as the agent and friend of
the heirs
